Why Not to Report



 Not required (if 2008 edition is referenced in your contract)

FY 15 Reported Mishaps and Near Misses



MISHAPS

- Cut Hand
- Foreign object in eye
- Back strain
- Dropped load from forklift

Near Miss Reports

- Worker found not wearing PPE
- Worker using improper lifting technique for heavy load
- Forklift backing without spotter

Other Reported Near Misses



- Trip hazards
- Unattended hand tools still plugged in
- Unsecured gas cylinders

Top 3 Mishap Causal Factors



HUMAN FACTORS DOMINATE

- Lack of Attention to detail
- Unsafe action/condition
- Failed to follow requirements

Crane Near Misses and Operating Discrepancies



Near Miss Reports

- Crane in service with ODCL deficiency
- Complex lift without complex lift plan
- Uncertified rigging gear
- Working under load
- Riding the load

Operating Discrepancies

- ODCL not filled out
- Missing PPE
- Inadequate safety brief
- Improper hand signals
- Loss of envelope control
- Load movement without signals

Crane Mishaps



MISHAPS

- Overload
- Dropped load
- Unplanned contact load to stationary object
- Hand injury

What is a Near Miss?



• A Near Miss is any situation resulting in no personal injury, no property damage, and no interruption in business operations (i.e. utility usage), but where a slight shift in time or position or the absence of intervention, the ongoing sequence of events would have easily resulted in injury, property damage, or interruption to operations.
