Navy, GovGuam Seek Traditional Healers, Practitioners for Safe Collection of Plants

ASAN, Guam (Nov. 12, 2014) – Naval Facilities Engineering Command Marianas, the Guam State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) and the Department of Chamorro Affairs are seeking traditional natural healers and other knowledgeable herbal practitioners/artisans interested in collecting plants on federal property prior to vegetation-clearing associated with future military relocation construction projects.

This effort is in partial fulfillment of the Department of the Navy's commitments under the 2011 Programmatic Agreement for the Guam and Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Military Relocation.
