Public Comments Accepted Through Aug. 4 for Two Proposed Projects in Support of the Military Relocation to Guam

PEARL HARBOR – Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Pacific announced today the start of a 45-day public comment period for new information associated with two proposed projects at Andersen Air Force Base (AAFB) on Guam in support of the Military Relocation to Guam.

Comments are being accepted for the Department of Defense's (DoD) identification and evaluation of historic properties and its determination of effect for Military Construction (MILCON) Project P-240: Marine Wing Support Squadron (MWSS) Electronic and Communication Shop and Flightline Armory (PA Memo #1).

This project is comprised of construction of a single story building which will primarily function as an MWSS electronic and communication shop and flightline armory. It further includes the construction of equipment wash racks and associated site preparation work within the North Ramp area of AAFB, Guam.

In addition, comments are being accepted for DoD's determination of effect and its plan for resolving effects associated with the North Ramp Future Defense Policy Review Initiative (DPRI) Design Studies (PA Memo #2).

This project proposes to conduct geotechnical and topographical surveys to support project design efforts for future improvements and vertical construction projects within the bounds of North Ramp at AAFB, Guam.
