What is the NAS Whidbey Island RAB?

NAS Whidbey Island was one of the first five "pilot" naval installations to implement the DoD RAB Rule to ensure local communities have a forum to provide meaningful input regarding cleanup activities at military installations.

The NAS Whidbey Island RAB consists of community members, representatives from the U.S. Navy, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Washington State Department of Ecology, and local government organizations. While it does not have decision-making authority, the RAB plays a crucial advisory role by:

Facilitating two-way communication between the community, DoD, Navy, and regulatory agencies about the ERP.

Reviewing and providing feedback on environmental investigations, cleanup plans, and restoration activities.

Ensuring transparency by keeping the public informed about ongoing environmental efforts and potential impacts.

Helping shape cleanup priorities by voicing community concerns and perspectives with the Navy and regulators.

Encouraging public participation about the environmental restoration process.

RAB meetings are open to the public. Meetings are held at least once a year. RAB meeting topics include ERP updates on the status of per-and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) investigations, Area 6 Landfill, State Petroleum Cleanup Program, and Military Munitions Response Program. Meeting announcements are published in the Whidbey-News Times and South Whidbey Record and sent via email to the mailing list.
