Systems Quick Links

This is a comprehensive list of websites that you will be using personally (green links) and professionally (blue links) broken down by whether a Common Access Card (CAC) is required to login.

Websites that are accessible without a CAC:

- Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southwest (NAVFAC SW) Public Page: learn more about NAVFAC SW and the different directorates
- Defense Acquisition University (DAU): DoD's center of excellence for training and education in acquisition, technology and logistics. Review the "DAU Recommended Review" document for tools and videos to view.
- <u>Small Business Administration (SBA) Dynamic Small Business Search</u>: contracting tool to search for small businesses by NAICS, cage, location, etc.
- <u>570 Circular</u>: repository of certified bonding companies, used to evaluate bonds from contractors (KTRs)
- <u>Fast Book</u>: lists receipt, appropriation and other fund accounts and symbols and titles assigned by the Department of the Treasury.
- <u>North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)</u>: the standard used by Federal statistical agencies in classifying business establishments for the purpose of collecting, analyzing, and publishing statistical data related to the U.S. business economy.
- Thrift Savings Plan (TSP): access 401K information
- Department of the Navy Civilian Employee Assistance Program (DONCEAP): Department of the Navy employees are busy juggling work and family and it is not unusual to encounter difficulties with stress, family, relationships, alcohol, work, or other issues which impact their quality of life. The Department of the Navy values its employees and has partnered with Magellan Health to provide a new centralized employee assistance and work/life program for employees and their families. The Department of the Navy Civilian Employee Assistance Program (DONCEAP) provides a wide range of services to employees and their families.

Websites that require CAC:

- <u>ieFACMAN</u>: A suite of tools consisting of eContract, eTracker and eProjects. Requirements start in the eProjects page with the technical side and once it is ready for Contracting action it will be pushed into eContract for execution and post-award administration. eTracker is used to send Funding Requests and can be used/linked in eProjects or eContract.
- Procurement Integrated Enterprise Environment (PIEE): suite of tools to post solicitations, review KTR invoices for payment, review Supplier Performance Risk System reports, etc.
- <u>CITRIX/SPS</u>: site that allows you to access SPS. Recommend working on getting CITRIX access before putting in for SPS access, work on SPS 101 & 102 in the meantime.
- <u>COBRA/DCAS</u>: used to assess the liquidation of a contract pulling the information from applications in PIEE and Defense Finance and Accounting System (DFAS) to get an accurate picture of how much money remains on the contract.
- TWMS: site used to track mandatory training if access to Waypoints is not available

- <u>Waypoints</u>: site used to track mandatory trainings and Individual Development Plans for journey-level employees
- Milsuite/Milbook: repository of NAVFAC SW Contracting documents
- Sharepoint (requires Flank Speed access as well):
- <u>SAM.gov</u>: used to post synopses (if applicable), ensure contractors comply with the requirements at FAR 52.204-7 and more.
- <u>Small Business Coordination Record</u>: site used to coordinate 2579, in accordance with DFARS 219.201(c)(10)(B)
- eSAMS: site used to track NAVFAC safety trainings, usually supervisor led
- <u>eDACM</u>: site used to manage acquisition careers to include registering for Certification training as well as continuous learning points
- OFCCP Notification Site: In accordance with FAR 22.804-2(c) KOs (or CSs) shall give written
 notice to the OFCCP regional office within 10 working days of award of a construction contract
 subject to exemptions at FAR 22.807
- MilConnect: With milConnect, Department of Defense (DoD) affiliates and beneficiaries manage
 their benefits and records through a convenient self-service portal. Integrated applications give
 them secure access to many of their personal and personnel records held in the Defense
 Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). The milConnect Frequently Asked Questions
 (FAQs) provide the most up-to-date policies, procedures and resources for making the most of
 their entitlements and benefits.
- <u>GRB Platform</u>: platform to register and manage benefits
- <u>DCPDS/MyBiz+</u>: create DPMAP, update Supervisor, etc
- myPay: access paystubs (aka Leave & Earnings Statement [LES], W2s, update W4s, etc.
